A Story of God's Faithfulness

Chilliwack Christian School, has much to celebrate as together we reflect on a 50-year journey; a journey that can be characterized by sacrifice, generosity, dedication, wisdom, and love. Those that have participated on the journey have been driven by a relentless desire to provide a Christ-centered education to God's children in the Eastern Fraser Valley, where Jesus and the Kingdom of God pervaded every subject, every teacher, every experience, every relationship,

every day. At this significant road marker on the journey, we rightfully need to stop and celebrate while we look back on the road travelled with its twists, turns, switchbacks and straightaways, in order to appreciate where we are today and continue our journey forward. But more importantly, see and express our gratitude to our faithful God, whose providential and provisional hand has guided and directed us through each stage of the journey.

On September 16th, 1969, the founders of Chilliwack Christian School, along with 200 grandparents, parents, students, and committed stakeholders gathered together to celebrate the official opening of four classrooms to approximately 60 students and four staff members. The budget in 1969 was \$29,000; tuition costs were \$60 for one child, \$67 for two children, and \$72 for three or more children. Many of the society members were deeply involved with the running of the school through the various committees. The Women's Circle worked tirelessly to provide a stencil machine, playground equipment, school stationery, and presented a \$600 cheque for new science equipment.

Since 1969, Chilliwack Christian School has undergone numerous transformations. There were building projects in 1983 and 1992. Unity Christian High School, in partnership with Agassiz Christian School, opened its doors in 2001. In 2013, an addition to Unity Christian School was completed in order to start a Pre-K – 12 school, and the original Chilliwack Christian Elementary School closed its doors. Experiencing rapid student

growth, a second addition was made in 2016 to accommodate four more classrooms.

Despite all the changes and transformations, the original mission and vision of Chilliwack/Unity Christian has remained steadfast and resolute. Unity Christian School continues to be committed to providing a Christ-centered education where students are engaged in the Word and the world. Moreover, from its founding in 1969, Chilliwack/ Unity Christian School has been a parentsupported, and to an extent, parent-led school. The names of committees and fundraising groups have changed over time but there are generations of board members, principals, teachers, staff, grandparents, parents, students, and community stakeholders that have given of their time, energy, skills, finances, and thoughtful prayer along the journey to bring us to where we are today.

The 50th taskforce is hopeful that as you thumb through this commemorative book and interact with the photos that you will both be reminded

of the journey and able to recall memories and stories as well as learn about parts of the journey you were unaware of. One of our original theme verses comes from Colossians 2:2-3, which expresses our hope for the entire 50th anniversary celebration:




Society approves subdividing off and selling the approximately two-acre site on McNaught Road for a total of \$1.5 million to CES Developments Ltd.
